New Student Registration

Elementary, junior high and high school students new to the district are asked to contact the school to register for classes. You may do so by contacting the school at 308-472-3427. Please see other articles in this newsletter for information on immunization, birth certificates and school physical requirements.

Junior-Senior High Class Pre-registration

Pre-registration and IPAD checkout for students in grades 8-12 will be August 6th 9:00 A.M. – Noon or 1:00 – 3:00 P.M., August 7th 9:00 A.M. – Noon or 1:00 – 3:00 P.M. Students are to register with Ms. Stutzman or Mr. Kidder.

7th Grade Orientation

At 7:00 p.m. on August 6th, there will be a 7th grade orientation program for all 7th grade students. The incoming 7th graders will be informed of the differences in the ways things operate between the elementary grades and the secondary grades. The students will be given a tour of their classrooms and will be given a copy of their 2018-19 class schedules. If at all possible please plan to attend. This meeting will be of value to you, but you are not required to attend.

Birth Certificates

Nebraska State law requires students entering school for the first time, or transferring from out of state, to present certified copies of birth certificates. The copy from the hospital does not meet this requirement. The official form bears the raised seal from the state and is issued by the Bureau of Vital Statistics in Lincoln. If you need a form for ordering the official certificate, please contact the school.

Kindergarten, 7th Grade & Transfer Students Physical Examinations Required

State law requires that all students entering kindergarten and the seventh grade must have a physical before school begins in the fall. Students who transfer in from out-of-state regardless of grade are required to have a school physical before entering school. School physical forms may be picked up in the office at any time or may be found on the web www.bertrandvikings.org. Physicals taken for athletics will be accepted for students in grades 7-12.

Also Kindergartners are required to have an eye exam, by an optometrist.

Activity Participation

Those students planning on participating in athletic activities must have a current physical, a signed student/parent consent form, and a Code of Conduct Form on file before they can practice and/or participate. Fall sports coaches will be contacting athletes directly. If you are new to the Bertrand Community School District and plan on participating, please contact Craig Newcomb, Athletic Director 472-3427, as soon as possible.

Immunization Requirements

The school nurse will be going through our files to see that students are in compliance. Parents will be notified if their children are not in compliance. If you have questions, please contact Dr. Dennis Shipp at the school or The Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services at (402) 471-6423.

WORK COMPLETED THIS SUMMER

Bertrand Community School completed several important facility updates this summer. The track rubber was replaced and the dilapidated asphalt underneath was repaired as much as possible. The track's red color is the color of choice for almost all professional level tracks. The red color as compared to the black color will reflect light, giving the track a longer life span. Hopefully, the track will last 2 years longer. The second project included a total sanding down of the East Gym floor, repainting, and re-waxing. It looks fantastic.

****Season Ticket Sales****

Tickets will be sold in the school office or may be purchased at the first few athletic competitions. Prices have been set as follows: Bertrand Students K-12 = \$30.00, Individual Adult = \$40.00, Family = \$110.00, Senior Citizen (55+)- \$25.00, Golden Age (65+)- \$10. Season tickets will be accepted only for regular scheduled home Bertrand athletic contests. Season passes are **not** accepted for any RPAC or District games our school might host. Regular admission prices for home and RPAC activities will be 65 & Older \$2.00, Adults \$5.00 and students \$4.00.

****Breakfast\ Lunch Program****

Bertrand Community School will be serving breakfast to all students/adults wishing to participate. Breakfast prices will be K-6 - \$2.25, 7-12 - \$2.40 and \$2.70 for adults. Lunch prices for the 2018-2019 school year: Students K-6 - \$2.95, 7-12- \$3.35 and \$4.05 for adults. Extra milks can be purchased for .30 cents per carton and seconds can be purchased for .10 cents. All meals (student and adult) are expected to be paid for in advance, at the school office. Notices will be sent to families when their lunch account reaches approximately a -0- balance. If a family balance reaches approximately a negative -\$25.00, notification will be sent home. Then, if a family balance reaches a negative -\$50.00, notification will be given to the family whereby their "lunch account" status is revoked until the unpaid balance is paid in full. Please help us keep our breakfast/lunch program operating on the positive ledger side.

Parents and grandparents are always welcome to join the children for lunch. We ask that you notify the school office in advance.



Immunization clinics are held each month and a \$15 donation is requested but no one will be turned away for inability to pay (Medicaid cards will be accepted). Parent or guardian must accompany child. Bring previous shot record. Please call ahead to make an appointment.

All students will be required to have had a second dose of the varicella vaccination unless they've had the chicken pox.

Notice of Non-Discrimination

Handicapped Child Find

Public Law 94-142 and Rules 51 and 54 mandates a free, appropriate public education is available for each handicapped child, age 0-21. Handicapped children are those defined as handicapped physically, visually, speech, orthopedically, mentally, specific learning disabled, behaviorally, multi-handicapped, home or hospital bound and whose handicap requires special services or education. Notice of Asbestos Plan Availability

Current Federal Regulations require all schools inventory asbestos containing materials (ACM) and develop a management plan to identify and control ACM in their buildings. The plan is available for inspection to the general public. The plan will be made available within five (5) working days after receiving your request. Medication

To be in compliance with State Law, the Bertrand Community School must comply with rules concerning the dispensing of medication. **The school will not dispense either prescription or over the counter medication to any student until an Authorization for Administration of Medication form is filled out and on file in the school office.** (1) Prescription medication, in its original container detailing dosage and frequency to be taken, brought to and left in the office to be dispensed; 2) over the counter medication **WILL NOT** be dispensed without Authorization of medication form on file in the school office and must be clearly marked. Over the counter medications such as aspirin or non-aspirin products will not be provided by the school. A daily Medication Log will be kept on file in the school office recording the student, time administered, dosage etc...

Textbook Loan

Pursuant to NDE Rule 4, the Bertrand Community School participates in the textbook loan to private school children attending an approved private school under NDE Rule 10. To make application of loan of textbooks, contact the Superintendent of Schools.

Student Handbooks

Student handbooks will be distributed to k-6 students in paper form and 7-12 are downloaded onto their IPADS. **It is required that a parent/guardian sign the forms included with the handbook acknowledging receipt of the handbook.** Please remind your child to bring the handbook home. **It is important that the forms be turned back to the office by Friday, August 24, 2018.**

School Directory Information

Federal law required school districts provide "Student Directory Information" to legitimate organizations, upon request of that organization, unless the student's parents ask that the student's name not be included. If you do not wish your child's name included as directory information to any group, please notify the school at 472-3427.

Bus Routes will be Established

Bus drivers will be contacting parents about approximate student pick up times in the near future. We will plan to pick up the same students who rode a year ago, plus new Kindergarten students, unless we are notified otherwise. We ask all new families to the district and living in the country to contact the school as soon as possible to arrange transportation services.

Student Accident Insurance

Students will be afforded the opportunity to take a student accident policy if they so desire. Your child will receive a brochure from Student Assurance Services, Inc. of Stillwater, Minnesota, the first day of school. If you are interested please read over the coverage carefully before submitting premiums. **THE SCHOOL IS NOT THE AGENT.** All claims must be filed directly with the company as outlined in the brochure.

When You Have Questions???

All Bertrand Community School personnel are interested in having good public relations with residents of our school district. We are willing to visit with people whenever they contact us with questions because we want everyone to have correct information. The only exception to patrons receiving complete answers would be when there are confidentiality concerns or comments might be injurious to someone's reputation, in which case we would have to decline to comment on that situation.

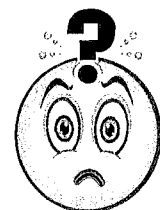
